

WOODHEY HIGH SCHOOL PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

Currently the department consists of 3 full time staff, 1 Partnership Development Manager, 1 SSCO, a Competition Manager and 2 part time PE specialists. A number of staff from other subject disciplines also assist in the teaching of PE across both Key Stages.

Within the 2 week timetable PE is allocated 4 x 1 hour periods at both Key Stages. At Key Stage 3 pupils are taught in half year groups and in single sex classes. Teacher pupil ratios are approximately 1:25. At Key Stage 4 pupils are offered an options programme which includes Trampolining, Fitness, Team Games, Badminton and Dance.

Pupils in Year 10 can study GCSE PE (Edexcel) or BTEC First in Sport. We currently have over 100 pupils studying exam PE at KS4. Additionally pupils can opt to pursue one of two Sports Leadership courses – JSLA or JFO.

We have a floodlit Astro turf pitch, 2 grass Rugby/Football pitches, 3 Outdoor Netball courts, a Sports Hall and a well equipped Fitness Suite.

The school has been awarded Government funding and is Bury's second School Sport Partnership. The PDM, SSCO, Competition Manager and Dance Specialists are all based within the department and contribute significantly to extra curricular PE.

The extra curricular programme for sport at Woodhey is extensive and extremely popular. As well as the traditional sports, we also offer Lifestyle Clubs, Indoor Rowing, Dance, Dodgeball, Street Cheer and Parkour.

We are looking for a well-qualified, enthusiastic and hard-working teacher to join a motivated and successful Physical Education Department. The appointed candidate will, through a variety of teaching styles and new initiatives, help to deliver a healthy and enjoyable programme of Physical Education. They will be expected to teach across the age and ability range and take an active role in curriculum planning as well as the monitoring and recording of assessment.

A commitment to extra curricular activities is essential. An ability to offer Hockey is desirable but also the ability to offer an additional specialism will further strengthen the application.
